

Attempted to Ban Our Right to Protest

AZ HB 2309 would create a new class 6 felony called “violent or disorderly assembly” for protests of seven or more people. ALEC-tied Rep. Bret Roberts sponsored the anti-protest legislation that would create a new crime of “violent or disorderly assembly” to apply to those who, along with seven or more people, intend to engage in conduct constituting a riot and cause damage to property or injury to someone else. The bill would make using laser pointers, fireworks, damage more than \$250, obstructing a street, public nuisance and more felonies instead of misdemeanors. Marilyn Rodriguez of the ACLU said the measure, “Allows police and prosecutors to target black and brown communities who speak out against the brutality they face at the hands of police each and every day.” The bill was recommended by the Senate minority caucus to pass in April, but it is stuck.
